Taiwan has twelve (12) Indigenous tribes whose rich cultures are shown in the Exhibition Hall of Cultural Artifacts inside the Taiwan Indigenous Peoples Cultural Park. The lower left frame is a writeup on facial Tattoo as a sign of adulthood for the men and women of the Atayal tribe and on the right is the practice of pulling the upper front teeth of the Bunun tribe as a symbol of beauty and adulthood..
