Kalinawa Art Foundation Mounts its 3rd Annual Visual Art Exhibit In Malaybalay City, Bukidnon

Kalinawa Art Foundation, a social enterprise raising awareness and appreciation of the visual arts of the Indigenous Peoples of the Philippines, is mounting its 3rd Annual Indigenous Peoples' Visual Art Exhibit in Malaybalay City, Bukidnon from March 11 to March 18, 2010, at Bukidnon State University Auditorium, following the city's annual Kaamulan Festival. With long-time curator of the Foundation's exhibitions Mr. Jun Jamero the exhibition will include activities such as an artists' interaction, community sale, workshop on epoxy clay molding, basic still life painting and textile painting. Hosting partner is Bukidnon State University.

Indigenous Peoples' artists are invited to participate in the exhibit by registering their art works on March 11 Thursday from 10:15 a.m. to 5:30 p.m and continuing the next day March 12 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. A total of P36, 000 in prizes which will be divided among winners of four categories will be presented at the Awards Ceremony on March 17 Saturday at 5:00 p.m.

Originally known as Bukidnon Provincial High School, Bukidnon State College started as a two-year secondary school in 1924. Upon the authority of the Director of Education, William H. Pickell, who was an American school superintendent for Bukidnon, the school was established. It was first set up to train elementary school teachers for the provinces of [Northern Mindanao](#) and the neighboring regions.

For the competition element of the event, the categories are: Traditional—pieces based on Indigenous traditional knowledge and/or materials; Youth—open category for artists under 18 years of age; Open Two Dimensional—any two-dimensional medium excluding photography, which can include but is not limited to paintings, drawings, tapestries and etchings; and Open Three Dimensional—any three-dimensional medium, including but not limited to sculpture, pottery and terracotta.

With the enthusiastic participation of the Bukidnon State University, this event promises to have a wide selection of art for the appreciation of the patrons throughout the world on the Internet and in Malaybalay City, Bukidnon.
